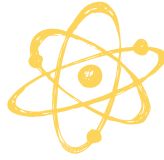
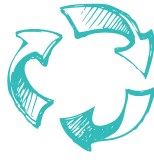


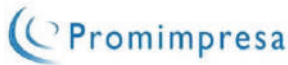

A few words about RecycleART

In Europe, every person uses 16 tons of materials each year. Six of those tons become waste and less than half of those (only 36%) are recycled. In the same, the delicate socio-economic period we are experiencing (the covid-19 pandemic) requires many of us to search for alternative ways to reinvent ourselves and preserve our self-esteem while doing so. In line with all of that, The RecyclART Project aims to create a transnational programme for educating ADULTS how to develop and apply creativity skills and abilities to:

- Support long-term unemployed adults by stimulating their self-esteem and problem-solving abilities through the means of art and recycling
- Setting up the participants on a successful career path
- Pay the environment back by finding new ways to transform waste into art

Creative Recycling

This project deals with two dimensions of creative recycling:

Occasional creative recycling: standard practices of occasional recycling and reusing of materials

Projectual creative recycling: a systematic approach to recycling and reusing materials

While the first dimension is related to our daily recycling habits, the second dimension combines creative and professional skills into a precise process: **NEED > PROJECT > WASTE > NEW OBJECT**

Target Groups

- (1) Long-term unemployed ADULTS interested in creative activities and connecting recycling with design.
- (2) Adult EDUCATORS interested in using creative methodologies and ARTISTS who are working or have worked with recycling materials, and are now interested in mentoring adult learners.
